

For Higher Risk Buildings

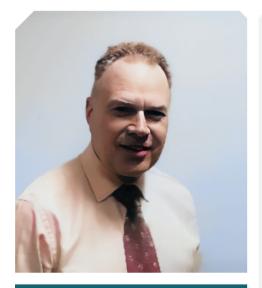
A ONE DAY MASTERCLASS
